About All Saints Pavement



The Parish Church of All Saints stands at one end of Pavement (so named, probably, because it was the first medieval street in York to be paved).

Today we are an active worshipping community who serve our parish, the Guilds and Freemen of York, the Royal Dragoon Guards (for whom we are the regimental church) and various ex-service organisations, visitors to York, and our own congregation who value the traditional liturgy found in the Book of Common Prayer.

We hold three services each Sunday; 9am Morning Prayer or Holy Communion (said), 10:30am Sung Mattins or Sung Eucharist and 6:30pm Evensong. Major festivals are celebrated midweek with an evening Sung Eucharist jointly with the other churches in the group.

Some 10:30am services of Mattins host guilds or military organisations and these are an excellent showcase for the church as they are very well attended.

All Saints is part of the York City Centre Group of churches along with St Denys, St Helen and St Martin, and St Olave. You can find out more information at www.allsaintspavement.co.uk or www.yorkcitycentrechurches.co.uk



Music at All Saints



Music is an integral part of our worshipping life. Our 10:30am and 6:30pm services contain hymns, a psalm, canticles or a communion setting, an anthem, and organ voluntaries. As well as singing the anthem, the choir plays an important role in leading the congregational singing.

The robed choir is a dedicated team of all ages including students and has been growing in numbers, especially for Evensong. We have an extensive choir library and the ability to buy, borrow or hire additional music.

We have recently introduced Choral Evensong (following a cream tea—a Cream Teavensong) a few times a term which has been popular with singers and the congregation. At Christmas and Easter we hold additional choral services which attract large congregations and we would like to build on these.

The church uses the New English Hymnal, the Parish Psalter, chanted canticles and a congregational communion setting, currently LJ White with the Merbecke Creed.

There is scope for the new Director of Music to enhance this offering, especially for special services, with something that is in sympathy with the ethos of the church and within the context of a Book of Common Prayer liturgy.

As well as services we host Summer Bank Holiday Monday organ recitals and numerous other concerts throughout the year.



The Organ



Our fine three manual organ was built in 1965 by Wood, Wordsworth & Co.

There is a detached console with a solid state memory system.

The organ is regularly maintained with at least two tuning visits a year and annual blower servicing.

Role Description



The successful candidate will be responsible for the musical output of the church.

This will include:

- Playing the organ for 10:30am and 6:30pm services on Sundays
- Playing for up to 10 midweek festivals and carol services
- Playing for occasional offices as required
- Choosing suitable hymns, voluntaries, anthems and canticles and preparing the monthly music list in collaboration with the Rector and Churchwardens.
- Rehearsing the choir, maintaining a suitable repertoire for services
- Ensuring that the choir remains viable by recruiting new members
- Attending quarterly Liturgical Planning Meetings with the Rector and Churchwardens
- Report (in writing or in person) to the PCC on the current state and future vision of music in church
- Developing, with the Churchwardens, the Summer Bank Holiday organ recital series
- Being an integral part of the All Saints community


